AHA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

“The Western Canadian Breeders Championship Show competition is sanctioned as a SILVER competition member of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC.

EACH COMPETITOR (THIS INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE RECORDED OWNER AND ALL TRAINERS, DRIVERS, RIDERS, HALTER HANDLERS, COACHES AND THE PERSON(S) SIGNING THE ENTRY BLANK IN AN ARAIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION RECOGNIZED ARABIAN DIVISION AT THE TIME OF ENTRY INTO A COMPETITION MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF A VALID AHA MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION CARD., JOIN AHA OR PAY AN AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITOR.

WHEN AN AGENT SIGNS FOR THE OWNER AT AN AHA RECOGNISED COMPETITION, BOTH THE OWNERAND AGENT MUST BE MEMBERS OF AHA OR PAY THE AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP.

SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP IS NOT ACCEPTABE AT AHA REGIONAL OR NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMEPETITIONS BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS IN LEAD LINE CLASSES OR PARENTS/GURADIANS SIGNING FOR MINORS ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS(BOD5/12)

EC Statement of Principle- Horse Welfare

Equestrian Canada (EC) requires adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The bond between horse and rider shines brighter than any ribbon.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

“All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of **Article A519, Vaccinations**.

All horses must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management

It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

If vaccines were administered by a veterinarian, a letter from the Vet can be sent in with the entry forms. If self administered, a completed vaccination compliance form must be sent in with the entries.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations EC ARTICLE A519

ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO PLAY

1. This rule is applicable to all competitors (including foreign at EC sanctioned events and applies to falls/accidents that occur at this event location

2. In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, (not limited to a direct blow to the head or loss of consciousness), the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite, through the EC Accident Injury Report Form before continuing. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. If the competitor refuses to be evaluated, he/she is disqualified from the event.

3. If the qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion (regardless of symptoms displayed) or believes that the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor is suspended from competition until medically released, as outlined in paragraph 6 below.

4. In the case of the preceding paragraphs, an EC Accident/Injury Report Form must be completed by either the attending Steward, Technical Delegate or the attending qualified medical personnel onsite and submitted to EC within 24 hours of the occurrence. It is the Steward's / Technical Delegate's responsibility to ensure forms are complete and submitted on time.

5. Any competitor suspended from competing further at the event on the basis of any of the preceding paragraphs will be placed on a medical suspension list, managed by EC, until medically released as in the process described in paragraph 6 below.

6. In the event a competitor is determined ineligible to compete per one of the above conditions, the competitor must submit the EC Return to Sport Form to EC, completed by a licensed physician/nurse practitioner. The EC Return to Sport Form will be processed by EC within two business days, at which point the competitor will be removed from the EC Medical Suspension list and may return to regular competition. If the competitor wishes to compete after being medically released by a physician but before the EC processing period of the form, the competitor must also submit a copy of the EC Return to Sport Form to the show secretary. In this case the competitor is competing at their own risk and may be pursuant to fines and penalties if the form is found to be incomplete in any way.

7. No competitor shall compete in an EC sanctioned event while on the EC Medical Suspension List. It is the responsibility of the competitor to refrain from competition, and the competition organizer may refuse entry to anyone currently on the EC Medical Suspension List.

8. These rules also apply to EC sanctioned competitors competing in FEI and USEF competitions

Rules and Regulations

1. All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Arabian Horse Association, Equestrian Canada, the Western Canadian Breeders Championship Show, the Show Commission, and the Parkland Arabian Horse Association, their officers, contract or volunteers or any of its affiliates, will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any exhibitor, his or her agent or employee, or to any horse or any article of any kind. The exhibitor will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury, to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify all parties listed above against any and all loss, damages, or liability thus occasioned, including but not limited to any and all legal costs, including attorney fees which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of any entry form to the Entry Secretary shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.

2. Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any official or volunteer of the Western Canadian Breeders Championship Show on the part of any owner, groom, rider, driver or handler, may result in the immediate removal from the show of said person, at the discretion of the Show Commission and the owner will forfeit their entry fees. Such action will be reported to EC and AHA for disciplinary action. Official protests must be made in writing, signed and addressed to the secretary of the EC and accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash.

3. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.” **Article A602.2**

4. “Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.” **EC Article A602.5**

5. By entering the show, all owners consent to equine medication testing of their horse(s) if selected, this includes all Breeding, In-Hand, and Performance Horses.

All horses entered in the show are required to pay the **EC Silver Drug testing fee** charge of **\$8.00** which is listed on the entry form.

6. “Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. **Please see EC General Regulations Section A – Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for Details.**

7. **Per Article A801**, every **entry** at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC, and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition.

8. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes **must** indicate the **name of their coach** on the entry form or specify that they are **self coached**. EC Coach Status is not applicable to Foreign coaches, however they must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare and have proof of insurance. **Canadian coaches** attending EC sanctioned events **require Registered or Licensed Coach status.**

🔗 EC Coach Status 2026

Any Registered Coach must purchase a Temporary Coach status directly from EC by logging into their “MyEC” to select the event they will be attending and purchase the temporary status online. Any individual listed as a coach that does not hold any coach status can no longer purchase a temporary coach status. (discontinued as of Dec 31, 2025)

Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 103, Coach Status

10. **PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE** The Person(s) responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rule while at the shows; The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations.

11. **Every entry form** for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the **PR** and be signed by the PR. **The Person(s) responsible** is ultimately responsible for **the condition, fitness and**

management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by **himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised while at the show.**

A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the **PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition.**

B: For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the **PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.** **Page 96 of the EC Rule Book**

12. **Person(s) responsible (PR)** must sign the competition entry form. PR must be an EC Sport Licence holder in good standing OR in the case of junior/minor owner entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR. (see **Article A213.2**).

The Person(s) responsible under Equestrian Canada rules must be **18 years of age or over** and sign as Trainer on the Entry Form. **Article B1302.4**

13. The Show Committee reserves the right to add, amend or delete any point not covered by the rules & to correct any error or make any necessary changes in the Prize List or Program. The Show Committee reserves the right to add classes or make necessary changes to tentative schedule but will exercise this with ample notice given to competitors affected by changes.

14. Except for Mares with foal(s) at side, no horse shall remain on the grounds if it is not entered in the Western Canadian Breeders Show unless written permission is granted by the Show Commission. **Every horse entered in this show MUST have a stall.**

15. **Hors Concours** will not be considered at the Western Canadian Breeders Championship Show.

16. Substitution of any horse will be handled on an individual basis and approved by the WCB show committee.

17. **Stallions ARE prohibited** from being shown in Junior Showmanship, Walk/Trot/Jog or Lead line classes.

7🔗 WCB Commission reserves the right to cancel any class with less than three (3) horses entered. **Potentially**, large classes may be split by into a Section A & Section B with the final section being held right after both sections.

19. **Barn Calls** are a courtesy. Exhibitors must ascertain when and where their classes are being judged. Every effort will be made to advise the exhibitor of any changes in the Venue and Tentative Schedule.

20. Please contact the Show Office to confirm any changes or check for posted notices.

21. **Gate Holds** are allowed at the discretion of the Show Committee and must be requested through the Show Office **one FULL session** before the class is held.

Two-minute Gate: In collective classes, the gate will close TWO (2) minutes after the first horse enters the ring or in large classes taking more than two minutes the gate will be closed at the completion of the final horse in a continuous string of horses entering the ring. After the gate is closed no entry will be allowed in unless approved by the Judge or Steward. EC B1306.8

The Paddock Master will contact the Show Office if it is an EMERGENCY!

22. **Exhibitors** are responsible for reporting all entries to the Paddock Master/Gate Attendant before each respective class is called for showing and must enter the ring promptly when called.

89j **Competitor numbers** must be worn in the schooling, exercise, warm-up areas prior to the class and in the show arena during competition. Failure to wear a competition number during the class MAY result in disqualification of the entry by the judge. EC B1306.9

Exhibitor number must be on the horse or on the exhibitor whenever the horse leaves the stall barn.

24. **Grooms and attendants** are to appear in the ring neat, clean and suitably attired, in the opinion of the Show Committee.

25. Any exhibitor may wear protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge

26. Riders in all Working Hunter, Jumper, Hunter Hack and all Hunt Seat Equitation classes (not to jump or over obstacles) and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fastened approved protective headgear. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. **B1501.22a**

27. DRESSAGE division riders are subject to Dressage rules: Section E, Chapter 4 - Safety Headgear. Approved protective headgear must be worn by all riders competing in all levels of dressage and dressage seat Equitation classes at EC Arabian breed Bronze and Silver competitions. This rule applies whenever the dressage rider is mounted on the competition grounds warming up for a test. Penalty for contravening is elimination. **B1501.22a**

28. No person(s) other than the officials, steward, attendant(s) on duty may enter the show ring without permission of the steward and/or call judge.

29. **Code of Conduct:** Exhibitors and Spectators are to follow EC and AHA code of conduct and ethics.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

1. **Patterns and Orders of Go** will be posted 24 hours prior to classes at the office.

2. **Sport Horse in Hand Classes** will use Pattern "A" triangle, Refer to EC Article B2405.1/USEF 1649E1.1

Sport Horse in Hand will be split to Dressage Type and Hunter Type for the Western Canadian Breeders Championship show.

3. The age of **Junior or Youth Exhibitors** for this show is **18 years as of December 1, 2025.**, unless there is age listed in the title JTR, JOTR, JTH are 18 years & under. Adult Classes are 19 yrs and over as of Dec 1, 2025. – AATR, AOTR, ATH, AOTH.

4. **Lead Line Exhibition Class #600** – is for riders Ages 2-7 years. There is NO Charge, and it is an EC non-rated class. Exhibitors may enter at the Show Office by Friday at 5pm

As of 2019, lead line exhibitors are required to carry an AEF membership. A free membership can be acquired through the Alberta Equine Federation Monday through Friday. Memberships CANNOT be obtained at the show office and MUST be received by AEF 30 days prior to the start of the class. Membership MUST be shown at the office to enter the class.

- Safety is the main priority**
- Child MUST wear a proper fitting Helmet**
- Person leading horse must be 14 yrs or older**
- The lead line must be attached to the halter & not to the bridle/bit**
- Saddle must fit child with the feet in stirrups**
- Lead line Exhibitor may NOT cross-enter any walk/trot or showmanship classes.**

5. **Scoring System is MOS – Majority of Opinion System** – See Current AHA Handbook. This system will be used for all WCB Classes including Halter Classes. Specialty classes – i.e. Trail, Reining, Dressage, Jumping, Sport Horse will be scored using the one judge system as indicated in the AHA handbook.

6. Western Canadian Breeders In Hand/Breeding Classes will utilize the IN-Ring Procedure. Western Canadian Breeders Championship in Hand/Breeding Classes will use the Comparative scoring system.

7. One specified person assisting with the entrance of in-hand horses into the ring, will be allowed to use only the same length whip and appendages as are currently allowed for the individual handling the horse. **EC B1401.4**

The specified person will not hit or use any other objects, such as trash cans, walls, etc., to make any noise. The use of plastic or paper bags of any type or size is prohibited in assisting with entrance(s) into the arena. **EC B1401.1**

MEMBERSHIP and REGISTRATION

1. Eligibility

- a. **Horses owned by Canadians and domiciled in Canada MUST be registered with the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR) or**
- b. **the Canadian Partbred Arabian Registry (CPAR).**
- c. **These horses can be bred in any country but MUST be owned by a Canadian. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- d. **Leased horses not bred in Canada ARE NOT able to compete.**
- e. **Horses that are Canadian Bred (as defined by the breeder's name on the registration papers) owned by a person of another country (i.e. U.S.) are able to compete and must be registered with the Arabian Horse Registry (AHA).**
- f. **Be properly entered in the Canadian Arabian Breeders Championship class prior to the closing date of entries and have attached copies of registration papers front and back.**
- g. **For the purpose of qualifications for the Nationals and AHA programs, WCB will have the same status, rules and membership requirements as a regional show. (Refer to current AHA Handbook) NO SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIPS**

2. **A 2026 Equestrian Canada Silver** sport licence is required. See chart A216: a) **An EC Silver licence with 2026 Provincial/Territorial (PTSO) membership is required for WCB shows** b) For EC-sanctioned/AHA approved shows: Owners, trainers, riders, drivers and handlers must be current members of AHA and EC at the time of entry and at the time of showing. EC sport licence is required as outlined above.

AHA membership with Competition Card is required to compete.

c) When **multiple individuals** are listed as owners of the horse, **only one individual is required to be a member**

d) Family – for competition purposes, the term “family” includes husband, wife, parent, stepparent, child, brother, stepchild, sister, half-brother and sister, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, grandmother, grandfather and in-laws of the same relation as stated above. “Wife or “husband” may include those who are co-habiting but not married by law.

3. **Amateur** – No fee will be charged in addition to the Equestrian Canada Sport Horse License, however applicant, must self declare on their EC membership. All exhibitors showing in AAOTR, ATH, ATR or AAOH classes or as an “ADULT” in ATH, ATR, AOTR, ATR classes must carry a current “Amateur” Sport License card from EC/USEF/AHA – All persons wishing EC amateur status must complete and sign application/renewal form affirming their eligibility.

For complete Amateur rules see EC B1303 Amateur Status

4. **US Citizens** with an active USEF membership will need an EC license to attend the event. A free EC membership can be issued using your active USEF number at www.equestrian.ca. EC's safe sport must be completed. Once Safe Sport has been completed it is good for a 3-year period.

5. Farm Syndicate or Business

All riders/drivers/vaulters of corporate/syndicate-owned horses must hold a current individual EC Gold or Platinum Sport Licence. ARTICLE A210

Business must provide documentation showing the owners of that business for owner classes. Joint ownership – if not IMMEDIATE family – will not be able to enter any “owner” classes

Photographer Permit

WCB has booked a professional photographer who is under contract for all “in ring” photos of the main and outside rings. and prohibits any outside video/photographer from taking pictures of the event in which they will receive monies from an end user.

Personal photos and videos from outside the ring are permitted but are not to be sold.

Farrier Permit

No other Farrier will be permitted to work on the grounds other than the official Farrier without registering at the Show Office. Exhibitors wishing to use a Farrier other than the official farrier must apply at the Show Office and pay a fee of \$100.00 before they can officially work on the grounds at anytime during the Western Canadian Breeders Championship Show.

CROSSING THE BORDER

Regulations at the border crossings change periodically and it is the responsibility of the hauler to ensure that requirements have been met.

The following are the minimum requirements but not limited to:

1. Entering Canada all horses require a negative Coggins test, dated and signed by an official veterinarian, within 6 months of entry.

2. All horses require a health certificate, signed by your veterinarian within 30 days of entering Canada. The certificate must state the horse is free of contagious disease.

RV Parking - Camping

1. **Contact the Westerner RV Park at 403-352-8801** to book your spot at the or near any of the barns or at the Westerner Campgrounds Overnight. Parking of All Recreational Vehicle Parking & Horse Trailers/Living Quarters MUST be registered with the Park Office!

2. **RV Power hook-ups** for the barn area are limited and only available on a first come first serve basis. **Failure to register** your vehicle will result in a **ticket being issued**.

AWARDS

1. **All Western Canadian Breeders Championship Classes**

a) **Full Top Six Awards will be named in each class**

b) **Champion and Reserve will be named from the Top Six**

c) **The Champion, Reserve Champion and remaining Top Six will receive a ribbon.**

d) **Unanimous Champion:** In classes with 3 or more entries and where three judges name the same champion, a unanimous ribbon will be awarded in addition to the **Champion Ribbon**.

Completion of Entry:

- Entry Form must be signed on the front and back of the entry form. 1) Person Responsible, 2) Owner, 3) Trainer 4) Coach or self-coached 5) Parent or Guardian if exhibitor is under 18 yrs of age.

NO Minor Signatures Allowed.

2. All Exhibitors still showing in Junior classes cannot sign the entry form, regardless of their age. They must have a Parent/Guardian signature on all signature lines (including rider and /or owner) the parent or trainer may sign as the responsible "parent/guardian" on the entry form understanding the responsibility of that signature(s) including most responsible person.

3. All horses must be entered in the proper class and must be entered in the name of their owner or lessee as per the registration papers. A copy of a registered lease agreement must accompany entries for the leased horse.

4. Any entry accompanied with a post-dated cheque will be processed on that date. If this is after the closing date of entries, the entry will be considered a late entry, and the double class fee will be charged.

5. **Returned Items** Upon receipt of a returned cheque a \$50.00 charge will be levied and must be paid immediately. After 30 days, a \$100.00 charge will be levied. If after 45 days payment in full has not been replaced, the Show Commission has the option to report the payee to AHA and EC for suspension and/or to impose further action for future shows.

6. **Cancellation of Entry:** Exhibitors cancelling entries after the closing date of May 25, 2026, shall forfeit ALL fees unless accompanied with a valid Veterinarian Certificate.

7. **VET OUT** Refunds will be considered upon receipt of a valid veterinarian certificate within SEVEN (7) days after the occurrence of the said illness or injury & received by the show secretary by email or at the show office. No vet outs will be accepted after 6:00 pm Tuesday June 23, 2026. Granted refunds will be sent by mail AFTER the close of the show and refunded to the payee.

The Vet out processing fee of **\$50.00** per horse plus the office fee & number fee will be retained on all entries that are on an approved vet out.

8. **NO REFUND of STALL FEES** for any reason after June 15, 2026, unless the WCB Show Commission has cause to resell it and has approved said refund. However, if there is another horse owned by and /or exhibited by the same person as the VET OUT horse then the new horse will be able to use the vet out stall as approved by the Show Commission.

9. **Acknowledgements** will be sent out by EMAIL to all trainers and owners. Please make sure that an email address is on the entry form.

10. Substitution of rider can be made if done one session prior to the class, except for rider change from semi-final to final.

11. Class changes must be made one day before the class being requested.

STABLING

1. ARTICLE A517 CRUELTY, ABUSE OR INHUMANE TREATMENT OF HORSES 1. 2. The abuse or inhumane treatment of a horse by an individual sport licence holder or other person at an EC-sanctioned competition shall not be tolerated under any circumstances. The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which, a person informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures, would determine to be cruel, abusive or inhumane. Any treatment or practice that causes undue stress, and/or pain, is deemed abusive. Sensory hairs of the head may remain unclipped or unshaven, but removal will not be penalized. 2024 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A

2. 2.All Stabling and tack rooms MUST be listed on the on the **Western Canadian Breeders Stabling Form** and mailed or emailed along with the entry form(s) no later than May 25, 2026, to the show secretary. **See entry form for prices.**

Day Stalls will be stalled in a designated area. Day.Stalls.are.to.be. listed.only.on.the.entry.form;

3. Stabling Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE after May 25, 2026. The Western Canadian Breeders Show Commission will review on a case-by-case basis for refunds after this date.

4. Every horse entered in this show or on the grounds MUST have a stall.

5. Horses must be entered in Western Canadian Breeders Championship at the time the stabling request is made. Indicate on the stabling form the EXACT number of Box Stalls and Tack Rooms required. If the show is overbooked, Show Commission reserves the right to use tack rooms for horse stalls.

6. Exhibitors WILL NOT move from their assigned stalls without permission from the Stabling Manager. Violation of this rule could result in the exhibitor and their horses being excused from the show grounds for the balance of the show without a refund of their entry fees.

7. For safety reasons, blocking or partial blocking of aisles is prohibited. Sufficient room must be left open to allow for 2-way horse traffic. Barns are to be kept clean.

8. Tying of Horses to the exterior of the stall or cross-tying horses in the alleyway is strictly prohibited. The "Person Responsible" assumes all risks and liabilities.

9. **Bedding: Each Stall will receive 2 bags of shavings at no cost** Additional shavings can be pre-ordered on your stabling form at \$9.00/ bag.

No shavings will be allowed in the alleyway of the barns or tents.

10. Bobcats or units with a Front-end Loader will not be allowed on the grounds for use in the bedding or cleaning of any stalls unless pre-approved by the Stabling Manager.

11. **Stall removals** must be arranged through the Stabling Manager, as this service MUST be done by the Westerner Staff.

12. All String, garbage, twine, nails MUST be removed from your area in the barns and tents. Any damage to stalls, doors, walls or any part of the "facility" by any exhibitor, trainer, or owner will result in them being financially responsible for the cost of repairs.

13. All ADS or POSTERS must be removed prior to departure.

14. Arrival and Departure-

a) **Exhibitors may move in no earlier than 9am on June 25, 2026.**

b) For Those requiring **early stabling**, please contact the Stabling Manager – **Debbie Storey -403-357-7108**

c) **Stalls MUST be vacated by 8pm on June 28, 2026, if late departure is required, please contact Deb Storey.**

Parkland Jackpot Class Rules

1. **Classes are open to Amateurs and Junior Exhibitors only.**

2. Classes are open to Arabians, Half-Arabians and Anglo-Arabians.

3. Horse and rider must be entered and have competed at the show

4. **There are No entry fees**

5. Prize money will be distributed: 1st- \$1000, 2nd to 6th- \$100.00 (in the event there are less than 6 horses' payout will be adjusted)

6. Top 6 will be awarded, Champion & Reserve will be chosen from the top 6 placings.

7. Random draws will be held for the exhibitors who entered and showed in the class.

8. Classes may be split if numbers warrant at the discretion of the show commission, Top 6 from each class to come back to show for the final Championship.

9. Classes will be run under the amateur rules for each division.

10. Classes offered: Sport horse, Hunter, English, Western, Ranch Rail.

11. The Parkland Jackpot Classes will utilize the 3-judge system for all of the Jackpot classes.

WCB Biosecurity Guidelines

Ensuring proper biosecurity at horse shows is essential to protect the health and wellbeing of all horses in attendance.

Preparation begins at home, well in advance of travel.

1. Horse Health and Readiness

Confirm that your horse is in good health, up to date on vaccinations, and fit for travel and competition prior to attending any event.

2. Stall Preparation

Thoroughly clean and disinfect any stall your horse will occupy. Remove all manure, soiled bedding, and debris. Wash stall surfaces with soap and water, and for added protection, consider using a disinfectant solution such as a 1:15 bleach-to-water ratio.

2. Minimize Contact

Take responsibility for your horse's wellbeing. It is appropriate to ask others not to touch your horse, and you should extend the same courtesy to fellow exhibitors. Avoid unnecessary contact between horses, including nose-to-nose interaction.

4. Temperature Monitoring

Monitor your horse's temperature regularly, as fever can be an early indicator of illness even when no other symptoms are present. Checking temperature twice daily during the show, as well as before and after travel, is strongly recommended.

5. Avoid Sharing Equipment

Do not share equipment such as brushes, tack, or water hoses, as many infectious conditions can be transmitted through shared items. Bringing your own supplies helps reduce the risk of disease transmission.

6. Stabling Considerations

Where possible, position your horse to limit direct contact with others while still allowing visual comfort. Using tack stalls or leaving space between horses can help reduce exposure.

7. Consultation and Communication

If you have any concerns regarding biosecurity, consult your veterinarian and communicate with show management for guidance and support.
